The Box Jellyfish

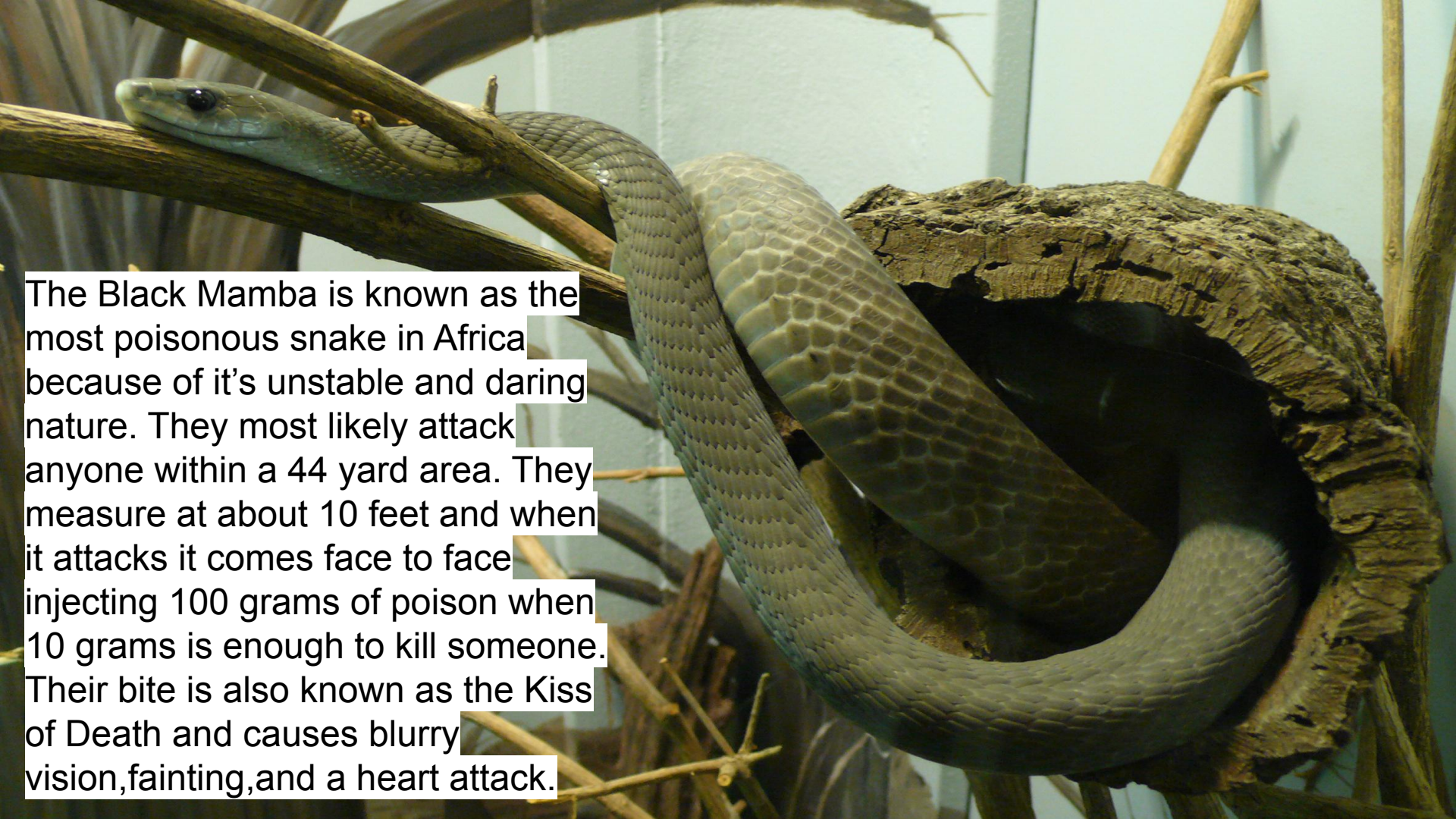

The Black Mamba





The Black Mamba is known as the most poisonous snake in Africa because of its unstable and daring nature. They most likely attack anyone within a 44 yard area. They measure at about 10 feet and when it attacks it comes face to face injecting 100 grams of poison when 10 grams is enough to kill someone. Their bite is also known as the Kiss of Death and causes blurry vision, fainting, and a heart attack.

The Saltwater Crocodile





The Saltwater Crocodile can swim up to 18 miles per hour and has one of the strongest jaws in the animal kingdom. They can also weigh up to 2,600 pounds and can be up to 20 feet long. They are the largest reptile in the world and they see humans as prey. In Australia more than 20 attacks occur per year.

The African Lion



The African Lion is one of the largest cats and can weigh up to 400 pounds and is 4 feet in height. Although they are very dangerous they usually don't attack people. Annually 500 attacks are reported. If a lion successfully hunts a human it's more likely to do it again.
